The paper by Bunakiye R. Japheth, Erho A. Joseph and Evans F. Osaisai focuses on computing in the oil and gas industry using domain specific modelling. Specifically, the authors presented a survey of model selection for the design of oil and gas pipeline.

In their paper, A. J. Jegede, G. I. O. Aimufua and G. A. Thomas presented a texture-based method useful in detecting impostor attacks using printed photographs. This paper is on computer security via biometrics.

The theme of the paper by S. O. Subairu, J. K. Alhassan, V. O. Nwaocha and I. R. Saidu is the evaluation of malware detectors on Xpaj.MBR rootkit. Using 15 malware detector tools, the authors carried out a comparative experimental evaluation of the detection rates and removal abilities of these tools with respect to Xpaj.MBR rootkit.

Mutiati A. Ogunrinde and Solomon O. Akinola, in their paper on software engineering, carried out a performance evaluation of a code complexity measurement tool from the perspective of student programmers and professional programmers. The tool is useful in building quality software.

And last but in no means the least is the paper contributed by Hamzat Olanrewaju Aliyu, Salihu Abdulkadir and Tajudeen Adeleke Badmos. In the paper, which is also on software engineering, the authors presented a framework for classification and allocation of software requirement elicitation interview questions with the aid of Zachman's architecture.

This is to seize this opportunity to thank our numerous readers, authors, reviewers and members of the editorial board for their continual support and patronage towards the production of this journal, especially this present Volume 13, Number 3, September 2020 edition.
